Overnight Code of Conduct

The Cradle of Aviation has a Code of Conduct to ensure that everyone at the Overnight has an enjoyable experience.

- Smoking is strictly prohibited anywhere in the Cradle of Aviation Museum (the “Museum”) buildings or inside any gallery areas.
- Food and beverage must be contained to the Red Planet Cafe area.
- It is illegal to deface, damage, mutilate or destroy Museum property, artifacts, exhibits or equipment, including altering or tampering with computers or software.
- Visitors may take pictures for personal use only, with a handheld camera and electronic flash.
- Please do not run or yell while in the Museum.
- Customers and guests are requested to wear proper attire (as determined by Museum personnel at their sole discretion) while on Museum property. Shirts and shoes must be worn at all times.
- Fighting, provoking a fight, or engaging in disorderly or boisterous conduct is strictly prohibited.
- Offensive, abusive or threatening language or behavior is strictly prohibited.
- Do not leave children unattended. Unattended children are not permitted in the Museum. For Overnight Programs, at least one (1) chaperone is required for every five (5) children. Accompanying adults are responsible for the behavior of their group throughout their stay.
- After Lights Out accompanying adults are responsible for keeping their children in their designated sleep area.
- All MP3 players, electronic games or devices should be turned off after Lights Out. Mobile phones should be put on silent.
- Pathways in designated sleeping areas must be kept clear.
- Failure to adhere to the rules and regulations of the Museum could result in your immediate ejection from the Museum property without reimbursement of your cost of admission. Please see the back of your admission ticket for additional terms and conditions, including the requirement that you consent to a search of your person and/or belongings, if so requested by Museum staff.
- THE MUSEUM RESERVES THE RIGHT, AT ANY TIME AND FOR ANY REASON OR NO REASON AT ALL, TO IMPLEMENT ADDITIONAL AND/OR MORE RESTRICTIVE RULES AND REGULATIONS THAN THOSE CONTAINED HEREIN. THE MUSEUM ALSO RESERVES THE RIGHT TO DENY ADMISSION TO ANY MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC WHO IS CONSIDERED TO BE A THREAT TO THE SAFETY OF THE PROPERTY OR GUESTS OF THE MUSEUM.
